## **Client Engagement Services**

Coordination of services and contact on behalf of a client and family to provide services to promote development and stability.

## **Law Enforcement**

Meet with local law enforcement officials to help gain cooperation, to negotiate unsettling issues peacefully with grass roots leaders, and become that bridge between law enforcement and the community due to lack of trust.

## **Social Responsibility**

Intervention services designed to assist and ease the transition of youth, ages 10-18, from childhood to early adulthood.

## **Human Trafficking**

Conduct sessions to promote awareness. Include, but not limited to human trafficking definition by law, forms of human trafficking, statistics, and reporting.

## **Employability Skills**

Workshops include but not limited to job application completion, resume preparation, interview techniques, good hygiene/grooming, and positive work habits.

## **Parenting Skills Activity**

A risk focused initiative providing parents of adolescents with the necessary tools to continue to raise their children free of non-productive behaviors leading to drug, alcohol abuse, and other delinquent issues.

## **Youth Gang Resistance**

Offer gang resistance techniques (improving self-esteem, self-confidence, and ability to handle peer pressure).

## **Tutoring**

Tutoring sessions for elementary (starting at age 10) in homework assistance and basic academic skill competencies: math, language arts, and science.

## **Annual Community Wide Event**

The event involves a collaboration of community agencies, businesses, and government working together to make neighborhoods safer.

## **Advisory Committee**

Consist of a diverse group of advocates charged with providing technical expertise in either: youth intervention, education, development, or law enforcement.

## **Community Police Relations/ Justice Circle Forum**

The forums create opportunities of educational exchanges in a concerted effort with community residents, adults, youth, law enforcement officers and other stakeholders. Forums included but not limited to critical conversations of racial injustice, fear of the police, communication and language barriers, and accountability.
